

Japanese Elementary 1

Course Content

Japanese Elementary 1 is an introductory course for those who are studying Japanese for the first time. The goal of the course is to acquire basic Japanese skills, mainly through conversation practice. In the first half of the course, students will use a textbook to study basic words, grammar, and conversational expressions. By the end of the course, students will be able to introduce themselves in Japanese, talk about their hobbies and how they spend their holidays.

Japanese Elementary 2

Course Content

Japanese Elementary 2 is a beginner's course for those who have studied Japanese before. By the end of the course, students will be able to talk in Japanese about their own country, Japanese culture and other familiar topics.

By the end of the course, students will be able to express in Japanese their experiences and impressions, as well as make oral presentations in Japanese using pictures and photos.
